### Seek:

Record your thoughts for sharing.

#### Serve:

1) In Galatians 6:5 the Apostle Paul states, "[5] For each will have to bear his own load." Consider how bearing your own burden (load) will help you in serving others in the coming week.

# Pray:

✓ Seeking the guidance of the Holy Spirit, ask God to reveal to you whether you stand accused of selfdeception. If so, ask for forgiveness. If the Spirit does not reveal such, ask the Lord to develop in you the same attitudes and actions of Christ in ministering to others.
